Historically, mountain snowpack has provided a crucially important fraction of California's water supply, but with projected climate warming in future decades, it is likely that the snow pack will diminish. This talk will describe the diminishing odds of achieving spring snow water volume that meets or exceeds median historical levels, and the increasing likelihood of extremely low snow water amounts.
